Conflict between families and health professionals is upsetting and time-consuming for everyone involved and may also affect the care and treatment of a child.

This interactive e-learning foundation course has been developed for NHS England in partnership with the Medical Mediation Foundation (MMF.). It provides health professionals working at all levels in children's healthcare with an essential toolkit for recognising, managing and de-escalating conflict between families and professionals.

The content has been developed with the support and expertise of health professionals and parents / carers who have had direct experience of conflict in children's healthcare. It is underpinned by peer-reviewed research from children's healthcare settings.

What the course offers


For those with little or no experience of managing conflict with families, this course gives you the tools to recognise conflict early and approach it with confidence.

For those with experience of managing conflict, the course gives you a range of different perspectives and additional skills to help navigate these complex and challenging situations.

There are three modules, each taking around 45 minutes. These can be completed at participants' own pace, saving work as they go.

Each module contains:

- Interviews with parents and health professionals
- Role play vignettes by actors
- Short conversations by facilitators highlighting key themes to support your learning.
- Exercises and quizzes to build your expertise.
